It was a "Wonderful, Wonderful" March Afternoon when one of the largest audiences in recent memory jammed the Empire Room at the Sportsmen's Lodge to honor JOHNNY MATHIS. The humble singer seemed a little overwhelmed by the appreciative crowd and warmhearted remarks from his friends on the dais.

John Royce Mathis was born in Gilmer, Texas and educated at San Francisco State College where he played basketball and excelled in track and field and took voice lessons from a local teacher.

Early in 1956, Johnny was invited to attend trials for the Melbourne Olympics and at the same time asked by Columbia Records to record a jazz album. Luckily, he chose music over a

career in sports. Soon after, he was put under the supervision of producer MITCH MILLER who steered Johnny into singing soft, romantic ballads. His second album included two songs that were to become among his most popular hits: "Wonderful, Wonderful" and "It's Not for Me to Say." This success was followed by "Chances Are" and "Misty," among many, many others.

BERNIE

DIONNE WARWICK said that "not many men qualify as 'pretty' but Johnny is 'pretty.' We all crowded the stage just to look at him. We're planning a project so you'll hear us together again soon."

DENIECE WILLIAMS, who also recorded with Johnny, talked about his humility.

BERNIE GARDNER

hired Johnny to sing with his band in high school and had to fire him because he was losing money. Many years later, Johnny asked Bernie to join his band as a pianist but he declined the kind offer from an old friend.

Boston Celtics center **BILL RUSSELL** said that "he felt like a fish out of water. We've been friends since 1949 or '50, but this is the first time in a long time that I've been in public without my cap — because today I want to take my hat off to Johnny."

PPB Past President **CHUCK SOUTHCOTT**, a Johnny Mathis expert, said that "in a group of people Johnny has the ability to make you feel like you're the only one there. I've never met a finer gentleman than Johnny Mathis." **GARY OWENS** indicated that "there's no one quite like Johnny Mathis."


Pro golfer **AMY ALCOTT** said that Johnny probably loves playing golf more than singing and plays five or six times a week. "He's a melodic golfer. There's a rhythm to golf that can't be taught, it's innate, and Johnny's got it. He's my Hall of Famer," she said.

Record producer **JAY LANDERS** believes that Johnny is "the kind of creative genius who transcends time and will be there long after the others have faded. Johnny's survived five presidents at Columbia Records." Jay read a letter from **BARBRA STREISAND** in which she wrote, "There are a number of good singers, a few great singers, then there is Johnny Mathis."

After a standing ovation, Johnny graciously accepted the **ART GILMORE** Career Achievement Award, saying, "This has been the most embarrassing, humiliating and wonderful afternoon I've ever spent. I love everybody in this room. Thank you."

FIRST VICE PRESIDENT LARRY VANDERVEEN presented the Diamond Circle Award to PPB member LEE MERIWETHER. Here are Mr. Vanderveen's remarks introducing Ms. Meriwether:

"Early in her career, our honoree was the very first Women's Editor on the 'Today Show.' After she held that position, those following her became known as 'The Today Girls.' This afternoon she's our 'today girl.' But she's better known as Lee Meriwether.

This celebrated actress began her rise to success when she was named Miss San Francisco, then Miss California, and yes that's right, she went all the way to Miss America. Ever since, Lee has displayed the dignity and grace that have made her so admired.

And she has also displayed the exceptional talent that has made her one of stage, film and television's finest and most enduring stars, receivand LEE MERIWETHER catch up in the ing both Golden Globe and Emmy Nominations for her outstanding work.

Lee was the Cat Woman in the original Batman movie (obviously playing against type). She was BUDDY EBSEN's costar in the long running 'Barnaby Jones' TV series, and Lily in 'The Munsters Today.' She's played recurring roles in such hit series as 'Dr. Kildare,' 'The FBI,' 'Twelve O'Clock High,' 'Mission Impossible,' 'The New ANDY GRIFFITH Show' and — well, if we gave you all of her major credits, we'd have to stay for dinner.

These days Lee is amazing theater audiences everywhere, including me, playing 23 characters in her nationally acclaimed one-woman show, The Women of Spoon River, Their Voices from the Hill. And just yesterday she returned from North Carolina where she was filming her latest movie, The *Ultimate Life*, the preguel to *The Ultimate* Gift, in which she also appeared.

But she says her favorite roles PPB's newest Diamond Circle Member, are wife of novelist MARSHALL LEE MERIWETHER, and our First Veep, BORDEN and mother of two LARRY VANDERVEEN. wonderful daughters, KYLE and LESLEY.



Lee is also very active in numerous charities. She is Honorary Chairman of Ability First, originally founded as The Crippled Children's Society, and she served as National Education Chairman for The American Cancer Society, just two of the many charity and humanitarian causes she finds time to help.




